Paint a Silk Banner

This is divided into multiple parts – three classes plus there are two drop-in times allocated if students need extra time to be ready for the next class.

Details:

Over the 3 days, I will take you through the steps of painting a 48"x22" banner. From designing the template, to tracing, to painting. In addition I will cover period banners. To save time, we will have to chat prior to the event to help you design your banner. I will supply your silk, the resist and the paints. Because there will be times when we have to wait for things to dry, you should be able to join in with other classes during the TUTR event!

Students should bring a scale drawing of their banner (I will chat with each person to help with the design ahead of time). They also need to bring materials for their painting frame -2x5' lengths of 1x2' wood and 2x3' lengths, 4 large spring clamps, a box of coloured tacks, green painters tape, water colour brushes, small and med sponge brushes.

Oh Darn! Mending Clothing and Fabrics

We spend a lot of time and money on our garb just like people did in pre-modern times so just like they did, we want to keep it looking nice and functional for as long as possible. We will learn how to patch, darn, and other methods of repair and reinforcement. The techniques will prioritize functionality over historical accuracy.

Students should bring any items in need of mending, needle, scissors, thread to match the item in question (preferably of the same material as the item, but embroidery cotton will work for smaller areas), any scraps of fabric to match the item for larger holes. They should also bring reading glasses or magnifiers; whatever is needed for close-up work.

Knot So Fast: knots, bends, hitches, and loops

Eastern European Dolls

Dolls have been used for thousands of years – for worship, the creation of effigies and burial companions, for gifts, for hexes, and for play. Dolls can be made of virtually any material from the finest silks to greenery from the forest floor. In this class you will learn the basics of folding and tying for a variety of different doll types using paper towels (a great fabric alternative when practicing!) and embroidery thread. Supplies are included in class. Students will leave with three dolls, and be able to see two more styles (that will not be taught during the class, but you will be able to discuss them).

Students should bring their own scissors if possible, otherwise there will be a few pair to share.

Knot More: Advanced Rope Management

Intro to Painting Glass & Tile Part 1

Enhance your dining table and/or encampment by using a modern bake-on enamel paint to decorate your glassware and/or ceramic dishes and tiles in a medieval style.

There are two parts to this class. In the first part we will look at some historical examples and then students will have and opportunity to paint a glass and/or tile. Additional 'drop-in' time has been allocated for students who need more time. The second part will be held after the Sunday feast when we will bake the painted objects to create a durable (and dishwasher safe) surface. If students are unable to attend this session, there may be time Monday morning, or the instructor will bake their creations for them.

Students may wish to bring an example of their heraldry or a simple medieval design. All materials will be supplied.

Introduction to the Basics of Charter Design

Have you often thought "I would like to try designing a charter (or Scroll) for the upcoming reign"? This class is an introduction to the basics of charter design that can be applied to either the Principality or the Kingdom. We will have a look at the basic parameters of a charter, even before you start with the artwork. We will look at the basics of layout, materials and tools. Cost covers all materials, tools and template as well as a handout.

This class is suitable for teens through adults. Not recommended for youth under 10 years of age. Students should bring their own 12" (or longer) ruler. If you have a concept for your artwork (Inspiration Source) you are welcome to bring it along, as there will likely be time at the end of the class to start the process.

Long- and Link-stitch Bookbinding: An Introduction

We will use manila file folders as covers, and copy paper for six quires/signatures, all sewn together with waxed crochet cotton. No glue needed for this handy notebook. Discussion will include examples and ideas for customizing future books. Procedures and skills learned are transferable to other methods, this being only one of many facets of traditional bookbinding.

Basic tools & materials supplied but as the supplied tools will be rudimentary, such as push-pins in place of awls, etc. One's personal tools may be... appreciated. Students may wish to bring a sharp pencil, ruler, paper scissors, utility knife w self-healing mat, fine awl, "bone" folder, and #10 crochet cotton.

How to Make Knaffe

5 Embroidery Stitches for the SCA

Whether you are embroidering on your clothes, your linens or gifts for friends, family, the kingdom, everyone wants some sort of embellishment. And embellishment is so very period! But where to start if you do not currently have embroidery in your repertoire?

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This class will teach you five basic stitches that will start you on your way: Backstitch, Chain Stitch, Blanket Stitch, Satin Stitch and Herringbone Stitch. Students will learn the steps to make each stitch come together, as well as learn if the stitch can be used to fill a shape, used in multiples, or whether it is the basis for many other stitches (some stitches, once the basic is learned, can become a class in themselves to explore all the variations!).

It would be helpful if students can bring scissors, but not a requirement.

Kefta fil furun (Kefta in the oven)

Intro to Medieval Clayworks Part 1

This class offers an engaging overview of clay as an artistic medium, blending both historical context and hands-on practice. Students will learn about the evolution of clay from ancient pottery to medieval ceramic art, exploring its cultural significance and technical uses throughout history. In the second half of part 1, students will delve into practical application, learning basic hand-building techniques such as pinching, coiling, and slab construction. In part 2, students focus on finishing techniques in preparation for the kiln. All works will be fired and returned, unglazed, to their creators through SCA mail. No prior experience is needed.

Intermediate Charter Design

This class is for all of those people who once thought "I could never design a charter". Did you know that tracing is a period technique? Yup! Tracing Graphite Paper (and light boards) are important tools that anyone can learn to effectively use.

This class will demonstrate and provide 'hands-on' opportunity to try borders and a variety of other clip art to create simple charter designs that can be used for use at your local branch. No prior experience required - just a willingness to explore simple (new to you) techniques.

Students should bring a straight edge, if possible, and may also want to bring a small note book for taking notes, etc. All other tools, materials and a handout will be provided by the instructor as part of the class fee.

This class is for beginner woodworkers that wish to learn the art of carving entwined hearts in wood. The instructor will guide you through the step-by-step process of designing, shaping, and refining a beautiful keepsake while learning the basics of carving. No prior experience is needed.

A whittling knife is required. Students should bring their own knife, or pre-purchase one for \$20 from the instructor by February 7th (you will be sent info on purchasing once registered).

Long-arm Cross Stitch the Mamluk Way

Students may be familiar with long-arm cross stitch (aka herring bone stitch) as a seam treatment. In this class students will learn how to execute this stitch to create counted stitch motifs from the Mamluk era.

Students should bring scissors; all other materials will be supplied.

Letter, Word & Linear Space for Calligraphy

Details:

Have you ever looked at a charter or scroll and wondered how they made it look so perfect and beautiful? The eye sees the negative space created by letter, word and linear space and recognizes when the negative space flows smoothly and supports the calligraphy. Many might suggest the negative space is as important as the Calligraphy itself. This class will share basic concepts that were originally developed and calculated by the Roman Masons back in the 1st C BC, in creating the Roman or Imperial Capitals, originally for the carving of letters in stone. These same letters are still taught as the printing Capital Letters taught in schools today. These guiding principals govern spacing in most 'hands' of Calligraphy with little exception.

Suitable for teens through adults. Open to younger youth if they are comfortable writing or printing a basic alphabet. Not recommended for youth under 10 years of age.

Cost includes all materials, tools and templates. An exemplar and handout will be provided. For this class the instructor will provide chisel nib felt pens for use in the class. Students are welcome to bring their own pens, ink and paper if they prefer t

Intro to Tablet Weaving

Students will learn how to set up a simple tablet weaving warp, including reading and drafting patterns. Once the warp is complete, students will weave a sampler and leave with all materials to continue the learning adventure.

Students will need a sturdy belt of some kind as we are doing backstrap weaving and it is essential for the process. Students will find it helpful to have scissors and may wish to bring note taking materias.

Stamping, Stenciling and Painting Fabric

We will discuss options that can also be used to "glam up" your work to give a period feel, without having to spend a lot of money getting the look you want.

This class is great for students who want to start out with the style without having to invest in more period (and potentially more expensive) supplies.

Heat Safety for Summer Events

Heat illnesses are not new, but global warming and our unavoidable habit of growing older are increasing the risk. In this class you will learn: How to estimate heat danger correctly (Humidex and heat index are not enough!) and adjust the estimate for individual people; What to do before and during an event to reduce the risk of illness; and How to recognize heat illnesses (including exertional heat stroke, which is not covered in most public information campaigns) and provide appropriate first aid.

Mustard Crusted Chicken or How to Please a Modern Palate with Norse Ingredients

Details:

Learn how to make Mustard Crusted Chicken, as served at Seagirt Yule 2023! This one of a few recipes I have adapted for modern cooking methods and modern palates from "An Early Meal" by Daniel Serra & Hanna Tunberg. "An Early Meal" offers "Viking" cuisine based on the archaeological record of available/popular ingredients and cooking methods used at the time in Norway, Sweden, and Denmark. We will discuss period cooking methods, flavour profiles, and seasonality in the Norse diet and possible adaptations made by immigrants in the western diaspora (Danelaw and Ireland) as well as the adaptations a modern head chef for SCA feasts may have to make for cooking for a modern palate, availability/price/morality of ingredients, and cooking methods. The foods cooked will become part of the Sunday evening feast. Students will come away with a leaflet of tested recipes.

Students should bring their own knives for chopping vegetables, and a towel for drying their hands. An apron and dish-washing gloves are also recommended.

Blackletter - Textura Quadrata Calligraphy

Details:

By the early 13th C the Early Gothic forms had evolved into a non-cursive, angular hand known as Blackletter, Textura Quadrata (or Old English). The name indicates the woven appearance of the lines of text, "textura" meaning 'an even effect in weaving'. (Art of Calligraphy, Harris, D 50). This hand is noteworthy for its lack of letter, word and linear space. All were kept to an absolute minimum creating the overall textural effect for manuscripts and other documents. One suggestion is that these Gothic hands developed out necessity because of the increase costs and lack of available paper in Northern Europe (the primary manufacturers and suppliers were located in Italy and other Southern European countries who closely guarded their product and their markets.)

An exemplar will be provided at class as well as all supplies, tools etc. For this class the instructor will provide chisel nib felt pens for use in the class. Students are welcome to bring their own pens, ink and paper if they prefer to use a regular nib. A C-2 Speedball nib of its equivalent is recommended.

This class is suitable for youth (9 - 11), teens (12 - 14) through adults. Youth and teens need to be accompanied by an adult and be comfortable writing or printing a basic alphabet. Not recommended for youth under 9 years of age.

Food Presentatiosn for Feasts & Potlucks

Carolingian Calligraphy

Carolingian, dating to the 8th C, was created by Alcun of York through the patronage of Charlemagne. Charlemagne wanted a standarized script that was easy to read and especially easy to write. Carolingian has genuine ascenders and descenders making it the first real minisucule hand. It was commonly used in early period manuscripts often with Uncial letterforms used for Capitals where required. As a result of its clarity and beauty it lasted as a primary hand for several centuries before evolving into the compressed, angularized Gothic.

Students will be introduced to the basic Carolingian alphabet and how to form each of the letters of the alphabet. This class is suitable for teens through adults. Open to younger youth if they are comfortable writing or printing a basic alphabet. Not recommended for youth under 10 years of age.

Cost includes all materials, tools and templates. An exemplar and handout will be provided. For this class the instructor will provide chisel nib felt pens for use in the class. Students are welcome to bring their own pens, ink and paper if they prefer t
